Mission Statement:

At the Bethlehem Food Co-Op, our mission is to provide access to healthy, locally sourced, and sustainable food options while fostering a strong sense of community ownership and environmental stewardship. We believe in promoting health, supporting local farmers and producers, and creating a more sustainable food system for future generations.

Who We Are: The Bethlehem Co-op Market

The **Bethlehem Co-op Market is a community-owned grocery store** committed to providing **fresh, locally sourced, and sustainable food options** to residents of Bethlehem and surrounding areas. The Bethlehem Food Co-Op was founded by passionate individuals in 2011, and in 2024 we will transition to Bethlehem Co-op Market to align with this next chapter in our organization.

We strive to build a vibrant and inclusive community around healthy food choices. We will celebrate the opening of our community-owned grocery store at 250 E. Broad St., Bethlehem in 2024.

The Elevator Pitch:

Bethlehem Co-op Market is a mission-driven grocery store owned and operated by its member-owners that has been advocating for equitable access to healthful food, supporting local food systems, protecting the environment, and strengthening our community since 2011. Everything BCM does is by the community, for the community.

What We Do:

- **Community Ownership:** We are owned and operated by our 1500+ members, who have a say in the organization.
- **Local Sourcing:** We prioritize sourcing products from local farmers and producers, supporting the local economy and reducing our carbon footprint. (See our Product Purchase Policy for more information on the tiered approach to sourcing)
- **Sustainability:** We are committed to environmental stewardship, implementing practices to reduce waste, conserve resources, and promote eco-friendly alternatives.
- **Education and Outreach:** We connect with our community, providing educational and social opportunities with a variety of different event types. Our MOVE Committee is open to everyone and focuses on Membership, Outreach, Volunteering, Education and Events to support the

Marketing & Membership Coordinator, spreading the word about our co-op and connecting with the community.

- Accessible to all: We are open to all shoppers, no membership required (however, our memberowners do get special perks)!
- Increasing Food Access: We will carry a variety of products and foods to meet the needs of our diverse communities. Additionally, we plan to accept SNAP benefits, Gold Plus (Lehigh University's dining dollars), and a Food for All program that subsidizes fresh food for those in need.

Our Environmental Impact:

At the Bethlehem Food Co-Op, we recognize the importance of minimizing our environmental footprint. Here are some ways we're making a difference:

- Reducing Food Miles & Supporting Local Food Systems: We strive to source as locally as we
 can, whether through local farmers and providers or mainline distributors close by. This helps
 support a robust local food system.
- Reducing Waste: We strive to minimize packaging waste by offering bulk options and
 encouraging reusable containers. We will be plastic bag free at checkout and implement other
 initiatives to minimize waste when it comes to food and packaging.
- **Energy Efficiency:** Our store is designed with energy-efficient appliances and lighting to reduce electricity consumption.
- Alternative Transportation Friendly: We are proudly accessible by walking, biking, driving, or taking public transportation. We have a crosswalk and bus stop directly in front of our building, a parking lot with EV chargers, and a bike rack.

Membership and Funding:

Membership: Currently, we have 1519+ members who have joined us in our mission to create a more sustainable and community-driven food system.

Funding: We have received generous support from various sources, including grants, donations, and member investments, to help fund the development of our community-owned grocery store.

- We received a \$2.9 million grant thanks to Congresswoman Susan Wild and Senator Bob Casey.
- Our members and donors also help contribute to the co-op financially.

- 30 monthly payments of \$10
